Curriculum Corner

In math, we completed Module 3 this week. In Module 3 students learned about multi-digit multiplication and division. This week students completed our final lessons in module 3, completed our End of Module 3 Reviews, and completed our End of Module 3 Math Assessment. We also started Module 5 (fractions).

In reading, we continued our second reading unit. This reading unit is a nonfiction/informational unit. We are reading a book called *Everything Weather* to guide instruction. This week students practiced synthesizing across multiple texts and identifying the key differences between nonfiction articles/ nonfiction books.

In writing, we continued our narrative (realistic fiction) unit. This week students officially started their realistic fiction drafts. Students also practiced elaboration in narrative writing.

In social studies, we continued our second unit on exploration of Washington. Students learned some background on the events that led to the Lewis and Clark Expedition such as the Louisiana Purchase.
