Curriculum Corner

In math, we worked on module 1. In this module students will be working with place value, rounding, multi-digit addition, and multi-digit subtraction. This week we learned about multi-digit addition and subtraction. Furthermore, we completed multi-step word problems involving addition and subtraction. Lastly, we completed the I-Ready Math Diagnostic.

In reading, we continued unit 1. We continued reading a book called *The Tiger Rising*. *The Tiger Rising* is being used to guide instruction in unit 1. This week we took a deep dive into learning more about the characters in the book. We learned about character traits, patterns, and goals. Furthermore, we did our second reading response. Lastly, we finished completing our first I-Ready Reading Diagnostic.

In writing, we continued our opinion writing unit this week. Students completed their outlines, analyzed a mentor text, and started drafting.

In social studies, we continued our first social studies unit about Washington's Earliest Times this week. Students learned more about the geography of Washington and the way it connects to different tribes (coastal vs plateau tribes). Students learned more about the way coastal and plateau tribes lived.

We are doing social emotional learning (SEL) every Wednesday. This Wednesday we learned all about respecting similarities and differences.
